Dear Parishioners.

I suppose we needed the rain! I hope today (Sunday) will be a clear day and a chance to bless the graves. Last week was a lighter week. There was a Thanksgiving Mass for the harvest at school with a wonderful display of gifts which will be given to the Food Bank.

Last Thursday and Friday evenings I attended the Inductions of two priests of two new parish priest who worked with me in my last parish. One at Bromsgrove, Fr Benedict Skipper and the second at Chelmsley Wood, Fr Sean Gough. I recall my first real parish and surprisingly I am only here on my third.

Last Sunday we welcomed the children from Year Six at school at our 8.45am Mass and what a difference it made to our Sunday numbers to have the parents of just one class in attendance. As usual I encouraged them to attend Mass on a Sunday in preparation for the Sacrament of Holy Spirit in Confirmation. This gift is given to those individuals to renew the Church.

Next Sunday we shall celebrate the Feast of All Saints Day with the new Mass Time of 9.30am. Please share this new time with your Catholic friends to avoid confusion.

This week is Half-Term in the schools. We shall be having a full electric survey of the Parish Centre and the Church which was last carried out in 2017 and should be renewed every five years. The lack of a recent report emerged from the Annual Compliance return to the Diocese. We have to show that our property is compliant to current safety standards. We have now had an inspection for each of the three buildings on site for gas, water, electric, health and safety, structure (quinquennial), asbestos, tree survey, annual check for the fire extinguishers, smoke alarms and emergency lights, kitchen safety. This is guite a job organise and oversee but a least I can say they are done.

As you can imagine, such activities as compliance can take up a lot of time. These are not matters which only the Parish Priest can deal with. I would imagine there are many retired parishioners who have the expertise to assist. If you think you could help the parish in such matters. Contact me. It would really help to have an administration assistance group.
