Dear Parishioners,

Thank you very much in anticipation of all your donations for CAFOD following last Friday's Family Fast Day.

The first Family Fast Day was organised back in 1958 by women from the National Board of Catholic Women, the Catholic Women's League and the Union of Catholic Mothers.

CAFOD was founded two years later and the same women, Jacquie Stuyt, Evelyn White, Nora Warmington and Elspeth Orchard organised the CAFOD Family Fast Day. In 1958 they raised £6,673.9s7d, the equivalent of over £93,000 today. In 1958 one pensioner donated five pounds (at that time the weekly pension for an elderly person), saying the need of others was greater than hers!

Today the needs of large parts of the world have not grown any less. That simple act of giving up a meal, or having something much more basic to eat, can go a long way to helping others. If for some reason you were unable to mark last Friday as the Fast Day, please consider doing so in the next few days.

Also, last week Pope Francis opened the next session of the Synod in Rome. In doing so he spoke about the climate crisis and expanded on his 2015 encyclical 'Laudato Si', highlighting the extremely worrying increases in global temperatures and weather phenomena since it was written. These changes have the greatest impact on the most vulnerable, often in the most impoverished areas of the world. (Only in the last few days there was a report of tens of thousands of fish and at least 100 dolphins dying in the Brazilian Amazon due to a significant rise in the water temperature and the secondary effect of reduction in oxygen levels.)

Maybe we feel it is beyond our control, but there are many small things we can do to reduce our carbon 'footprint' in this world. Can we work alongside our fellow local Christians to do what we can to make a difference? There's a committee meeting of Churches Together in Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath on 17th October, and amongst other things it/we will be discussing ECO Church. (We also need some more representation urgently on the committee, please!)

Your suggestions on how we can collaborate would be most welcome! Please post a message to our website for us to pick up! Thank you!
