Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is Education Sunday. Many of you have supported our Catholic Schools as pupils, parents, teachers, governors and parishioners. Many helped to establish our Primary School, fund raising for equipment, extensions and the new classroom. Choosing to send your child to a Catholic school allows them to learn about our Christian religion, prepare for the Sacraments and learn how to live them. Foundation governors manage the school and help to choose our teachers. Catholic teachers are like gold dust. We need to encourage young people to consider the 'vocation' of teaching. Catholic teachers are leaders of the faith and by their example they communicate what it means to be a follower of Christ.

To discern this call takes lots of prayer and encouragement. Is the Holy Spirit calling you for ministry in the Catholic Church? We need 2 men from our parish to train as Permanent Deacons. Deacon Stephen can give you more info. We need single men to train for the priesthood. The vocation in your soul calls you to serve the church in many different roles: as priests, teachers, youth workers, catechists, nurses, doctors, parents, single people and especially 'pray-ers' who never stop praying for us all.


