Dear Parishioners,

This week we shall celebrate the Feast of St Joseph, the Worker on Wednesday 1st May. It marks the beginning of a month traditionally dedicated to Mary and reminds us that St Joseph in his work as a carpenter actively provided for his family by earning his living. We know Jesus watched Jospeh in his work and when he was old enough would have been taught the skills to one day provide Him with a good living. On Wednesday we give thanks to God for the example and faith of St Joseph and for all those work for a living. (Up the workers!)

Two new workers in our vineyard have been created by Pope Francis. Canon Richard Walker and Monsignor Timothy Menezes become two new Auxiliary Bishops for our Diocese. We congratulate them on their appointment. It will leave two vacancies for a new Vicar General and Dean or administrator of St Chad's Cathedral. We are not waiting by the phone!

The Election will take place on Thursday for the Mayor of Birmingham, the Police Commissioner and in the Solihull area for a third of the Councillors. Please cast your vote and remember to take photo or sufficient identification to the Polling Station. The responsibility to use our vote wisely is an essential element of our Christian calling and for the sake of the common good.

Just a reminder that this weekend is our special second collection for Church Maintenance. Those of you who use the Presbytery side carpark will have seen the scaffolding on the corner of the church. This cost £400 and is to facilitate a safe inspection of the roof and mortar joints. There are signs of water ingress above the confessional box. I hope the repair cost will not be too much but my estimate on the basis of similar types of work is that it will not be less that two thousand pounds. Still I live in hope and perhaps it will be a simple repair. The latest quote for the new doors on the Parish Centre as the existing ones are warped came to four thousand pounds. This is for a hard wood door. A similar quote is for a metal door. Which one would you choose?

I shall be consulting with Our Lady and St Josph on this and all the decisions for the good of the parish.
