Dear Parishioners,

Congratulations to the children from the Parish Catechism class who will make their First Holy Communion on Sunday morning at the 10.30am Mass. Last weekend 28 children from the Parish School received their First Holy Communion. It was a memorable occasion for us all and good to see them at the 8.45 am and 10.30 am Mass on Sunday. We hope and pray they will be able to continue to practise the faith they have received. Together we are the family of God. Thank you to our faith leaders at school for preparing and encouraging the children.

This is not a cause for despondency but an opportunity to consider our priorities. Archbishop Bernard has encouraged us to think about the future of the Diocese in his recent pastoral letters. He has focussed on the themes of evangelisation, formation, youth, liturgy and worship, and social outreach.
