# 21st January 2024 3rd Sunday of the Year

Dear Parishioners.

Last weekend and indeed for the entire week we have endured much cold weather with freezing temperatures causing problems of frozen pipes. The Church and house experienced a few issues but thankfully were sorted out for us by our amazing plumber. This weekend we shall hopefully be able to bring some warm coats, scarves, hats and gloves for the needy in Druids Heath following an appeal from the SVP in that area. Actually it came before Christmas and our SVP responded with a donation of over £500 to help to buy blankets. Now we can do an early spring tidy up and clear out by bringing what we do not need to the Church. Perhaps if you are reading this at home on Saturday or after Mass on Sunday you might pop back to the Parish Centre where your donations will be received.

In 1990 I was helping out at S. Gregorio which was a monastery taken over by the Mother Teresa Sisters. The college I belonged to had an SVP and we volunteered there at the men's hostel, serving food, washing up, sorting and distributing clothes. The people of Rome were incredibly generous and many of the clothes were still in their original packaging. At the time I recall noticing a lovely coat which fitted me perfectly so I put it to one side. God had other ideas! A homeless man came to ask for a coat. He tried one or two but they were the wrong length or didn't fit. I realised there was only one which would be perfect for him and found the beautiful three-quarter length camel coat I had earmarked for myself. It fitted perfectly, it looked the part, the man was very happy and I learned a lesson of St Francis of Assisi, "it is in giving that we receive."

I have a couple of notices to share with you. Bishop David Evans will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 30 children from the parish both school and from Isabel's catechism class. We are expecting about 300 people at the 10.30am Mass on Sunday  $4^{th}$  February. You may prefer to attend the vigil at 5.30pm on Saturday or the 8.45am on Sunday Morning with Childrens Liturgy.

I have decided to have one collection a month for Church Maintenance and will in due course provide a list of dates in the newsletter.

Lent begins on February 14<sup>th</sup> – on Ash Wednesday. From and including Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> February there will be Exposition from 4pm – 4.45pm with Confession and at 5pm Stations of the Cross. This might be combined with your afternoon constitutional.

Next weekend there will be a second collection for Lepra, the organisation which cares for lepers.
