Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Birthday of the Church. Today is Pentecost Sunday. On this day we celebrate the occasion when the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles to inspire them to preach the Gospel of Jesus to all the nations many of which were represented in Jerusalem. The next major parish events will be the First Holy Communion Masses. The School will have theirs on Saturday  $10^{th}$  June at 11 am. The Parish Catechism Class will have their First Holy Communion on Sunday  $18^{th}$  June at 10.30 am.
