Dear Parishioners,

In my sermons at Mass on Sunday I have been drawing out the significance of the Church as a community or family of believers. Each one of us belong to the family by virtue of our Baptism when we received the gift of faith. When we leave our home and come to church we may feel alone or on a mission but once we have arrived in church we gather in common purpose with our fellow believers and collectively the Holy Spirit, that resides in us. Look at that word "community" and we see two words "communion" and "unity". To be in communion with each other means we share the same ethos, to be in Christian communion means we are part of the Body of Christ, to be part of a body means we are a key part of the living being. In Mass and during any occasion when the Body gathers, our strength is our unity. This is a strong argument for understanding the call to gather the community for Mass and for such occasions when the community can be together. Most families look forward to those times when they can meet each other. They find strength and support by sharing their thoughts and ideas, gathering for meals, social occasions, sharing in the joys and sorrows of life together. My hope and vision for our community is that we are united by our faith and that we take every opportunity to meet together in Mass and in our social time together. If you are one of those people who never meets your fellow parishioners after Mass, try to overcome your fears and rearrange your priorities. Sometimes I feel sad when I see parishioners who every weekend are in a hurry to get away. I am sure there are sometimes genuine reasons but an occasional action can become a habit. If you have only an hour our less to give to being with your Christian family in a week of 168 hours then maybe it is time to rearrange your priorities.

I hope every member of our family has their own thoughts on what a community of believers is or can be. We can look to what has gone before and our faith requires us to learn from the past but to walk forwards into the light. St Benedict tells his monks to listen especially to the younger monks. I would like to hear their thoughts and consider them with you but also to hear the views of everyone. I would like to share those thoughts together to reflect on what the Holy Spirit is saying to us. I would like to begin a dialogue and engage with as many people as possible. I shall announce the first place where I would like to meet next weekend. Watch this space!
