## TWENTY NINETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 22nd October 2023

Dear Parishioners,

We have not had any heating in the church at a time when we might normally have switched it on. I am told the new system will be up and running this weekend so I hope it is working. Having said this the weather, although incredibly wet over the last few days has been warm. The leaks in the hall corridor roof where we had problems last year all seem to be ok at the moment but can you believe there is a new leak in the narthex roof! This could be due to a blocked gutter and would only take someone with a ladder and a little agility to take a look.

Herein lies the problem I have been grappling with since I arrived in the parish which is how to manage the buildings. The quinquennial inspections of the buildings and site tell us what needs to be done but I am afraid I do not have the knowledge and I really need help. What I need is a Building Committee. Every parish is required to have one by the diocese but we don't. The remit of such a committee is to plan and prioritise the various repairs and maintenance and advise me of the progress. I know there are members of our congregation who have overseen extensions to your properties and of course the various ongoing repairs and maintenance. Your experience could be used for the church. I am not asking you to do the repairs. I do not want things done on the cheap but to help to maintain what is your church.

One day you will need to rent out the Presbytery when there are no priests living on site. (5-10 years hence.) Currently the Presbytery would not be in a fit state to because it is not up to date and has failed the few tests I have had have done in the last year. The electrics are out of the dark ages, it is very cold so there is no insulation, the kitchen was last updated about 40 years ago. This is where your priests are housed. We are conscious of our dependence on the generosity of parishioners. A proper Building Committee takes responsibility for these matters on behalf of the parish and is a long-term investment for the good of the parish. I appeal to you to offer your support for a Building Committee. We need about 7 people. Experience of home maintenance and management is the only requirement, common sense and a sense of humour is also essential. Come on St George and St Teresa's. I need your help!

Mass Intentions: Have you ever asked to have a Mass said for a special intention? Here is how to go about it. In the Narthex there are smallish brown envelopes on which you write the name of the person or intention. It can be for the living or for the repose of the soul of the faithful departed. You might want to remember a significant wedding anniversary or birthday. We ask for the name of the donor and will put your initials in brackets on the newsletter so you know the Mass being said is your intention. You can request a set date but be aware weekends get booked up. The suggested donation is £10. This is taken by the priest who offers the Mass for your intention and used to keep him for the day. As most of us are aware £10 does not go very far. It might provide for a cup of coffee and a toasted sandwich at Costa's. So a little more than that would be much appreciated. You might also like to send a card to a person to let them know you are having a Mass said for them. There is a good selection. If you are not sure what to do, please ask. The completed brown envelope can be put in the collection, posted through the Presbytery letter box (no need to ring the bell), handed in at the sacristy before or after Mass, or given to the priest. The intention is recorded and if there is a problem eg your handwriting is illegible, or you've asked for a date when the church is not open, or if there is a funeral on that day, your best contact number is helpful.
