# St. George & St. Teresa Catholic Church Dorridge Fourth Sunday of Easter 30th April 2023



Dear Parishioners.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and there will be a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Bernard. The Bank Holiday is repeated next weekend giving a holiday atmosphere and I know some of us have decided to combine the two Bank Holidays to make a slightly longer holiday.

There is not a great deal going on in the parish over this time and I am not sorry. Last week the virus manifested itself as a chest infection. It started last Sunday afternoon and thankfully I am getting through it. Everyone says give yourself time to get better. So I am taking your advice.

We had another leak from the roof repair in the hall corridor so I hope this will be attended to very soon. The dishwasher detergent and rinse aid have been fitted so the machine is ready to roll. There are about 7 pages of instructions which I have condensed into two sides of A4. It is quite a simple operation but needs about half an hour to heat up after being switched on. (Not unlike myself in the morning!) It is a steriliser so food will need to be washed off the plates before they go into the machine. It is a 10 minute cycle.

While stuck at home I have been catching up with the meeting I had the Eucharistic Ministers back in January so and you may receive an email from me – especially if you were on the 2017 list. One person I contacted emailed to say they had moved to Scotland! This is what happens with lists. Similarly I note how many of us have almost stopped using our home phones in favour of your mobiles.

The Diocese insists that everyone who is involved in any sort of parish ministry has an up to date DBS. If you are on any sort of rota where you deal with parishioners this is essential. I have just completed two further courses on safeguarding and there are a couple of administrative policies which we don't seem to have so I will be putting these in place.

Deacon Stephen and I will be working through the Health and Safety programme which is a requirement of the Diocesan Insurers. If you are good at this sort of thing or have any experience of it through work, I would appreciate some help.

The Parish Mass for the Sick will be on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> May at 2pm. It will be a proper Mass but the homily is replaced by the anointing of the sick. It will 'count' as a Sunday Mass. Afterwards there will be refreshments in the hall so I would be grateful if those of you who bake or create table decorations could provide a nice afternoon tea for our VIP's.

That's all for now so I wish you all a pleasant Bank Holiday weekend.

Oh and I nearly forgot there will be a Mass and prayers for our new King Charles III on Friday. The Bishops have asked all parishes to offer a special Mass for our new monarch. There is a special prayer card for each parishioner. Please take one.
