Dear Parishioners,

You began the season of Lent with gusto! We have never seen so many people for Ash Wednesday. Well done to those who made the effort. Maybe keep it up by coming to an extra mass during the week – the ultimate prayer of the church. Now we get down to the serious business of our Lenten resolutions: Prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent can be like a game of cat and mouse because the devil will be working hard to catch us when we are off guard. I expect he is up to his old tricks already. He can be very persuasive.

The first full week of Lent ends with Friday Family Fast Day. One of our Lenten resolutions is fasting and traditionally Friday, the day of the death of Jesus, is when we commemorate his sacrifice by abstinence. Opting for fish on Friday is traditionally the Christian way of fasting. Were chips and mushy introduced by Friar Tuck? Fasting from food is about self denial which teaches us self discipline and the ability to say "no". Self-denial is not easy and we need to pray hard to achieve it. In our prayers we remember those who hunger for food and water due to poverty, disasters, famine and drought. The victims are members of God's family, sisters and brothers, parents and relations across the world. Our ears are opened to their cry for help. "Ephphatha" Jesus said to the man who was deaf. Through our faith, Jesus opens our eyes and ears to see, hear and love our neighbour. Of course, not everyone can fast especially if you are on medication, old or frail but we can pray for the needy and offer a donation to help the aid agencies bring shelter and warmth, medication and food to those who need it.

Many of us have set ourselves the target of denying ourselves some particular luxury during Lent. For example, chocolate, alcohol, biscuits, puddings, watching tv, learning to put aside our phone or computer etc. The effort will require prayer and focus on the goal, knowing the discipline won will be a stronger defence against the wiles of the devil who seeks our downfall. Let us reflect on the example of the Gospel and invoke his blessing on us as we seek to imitate Christ. It is good to remind ourselves of the goal which is to prepare for the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter Sunday.
